Update on Crown land

Gatwick Airport Northern Runway Application for a Development Consent Order (the "DCO")

Request for consent pursuant to Section 135 of the Planning Act 2008 in relation to the interests and rights held by the SSHD within the DCO Order limits as shown on the Crown Land Plans

We are aware that Gatwick Airport Limited ("GAL") has applied for a DCO under the Planning Act 2008 ("the Act") for the Gatwick Airport Northern Runway Project ("the Scheme"). I am instructed to respond on behalf of the Secretary of State for the Home Department (the "SSHD") in respect of the DCO.

The land required for the DCO includes land in which the SSHD has an interest and therefore constitutes Crown land as defined in section 227 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the **Act**"). The SSHD has received a request from GAL for certain approvals under section 135 of the Act in relation to this land.

Consent under s135(1)

Section 135(1) of the Act requires that, where an undertaker wishes to include a provision in a DCO which authorises the compulsory acquisition of a non-Crown interest in 'Crown land'

(being defined in section 225 of the Act), consent must be given by the appropriate Crown authority.

The inclusion of the land in which the SSHD has an interest within the Order limits of the DCO will enable GAL to compulsory acquire the rights for the authorised development (i.e. the rights to enable the construction, operation and maintenance of the Scheme) over the relevant land.

The appropriate Crown authority to give Crown land consent under s135(1) in relation to the Scheme is the SSHD, and I confirm that such consent is given by this letter.

Consent under s135(2)

Section 135(2) of the Act requires the consent of the appropriate Crown authority to the inclusion in a DCO of 'any other provision' applying to 'Crown land' or rights benefitting the Crown. This would comprise all other powers set out in the DCO which affect the land in which the SSHD has an interest/right within the Order limits, including the rights to temporarily possess and use the relevant land to carry out the works authorised by the DCO.

The appropriate Crown authority to give Crown land consent under s135(2) in relation to the Scheme is the SSHD, and I confirm that such consent is given by this letter.

The SSHD notes that Article 44 of the DCO, entitled "Crown Rights" contains wording which is protective to the interests of Crown authorities affected by the proposals of the DCO and the SSHD hereby agrees to the wording as drafted.
