However, I note that c1,000 vehicle movements a day are forecast in the area and was disappointed that there is not a clear, concomitant focus on the potential this increased traffic gives to RTAs in the area. I would hope that this monitored with a view to mitigation.

I was also slightly perturbed by the following paragraph under the traffic section and would hope that there is no permanent loss to recreational opportunities in the area by the potential permanent closure of footpaths or cycle paths for local residents

6.14.19 If, during construction and operation, any roads, footpaths, cycleways, bridleways etc are to be temporarily or permanently closed
